
## St. Richard Parish





This weekend of the Fifth Sunday of Easter, we are wondering why does Jesus in the gospel speak of himself as the *true vine*? The image of the vine was a rich one for the Jews since the land of Israel was covered with numerous vineyards. It had religious connotations to it as well. Isaiah spoke of the house of Israel as *"the vineyard of the Lord"* (Isaiah 5:7). Jeremiah said that God had planted Israel *"as his choice vine"* (Jeremiah 2:21). When Jesus calls himself the *true vine* he makes clear that no one can claim their spiritual inheritance through association with a particular people or bloodline. Rather, it is only through Jesus Christ that one can become grafted into the true "vineyard of the Lord".

Jesus offers true life - the abundant life which comes from God and which results in great fruitfulness. How does the vine become fruitful? The vinedresser must carefully prune the vine before it can bear good fruit. Vines characteristically have two kinds of branches - those which bear fruit and those which don't. The non-bearing branches must be carefully pruned back in order for the vine to conserve its strength for bearing good fruit. Jesus used this image to describe the kind of life he produces in those who are united with him - the fruit of "righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit" (Romans 14:17).

There is a simple truth here: We are either fruit-bearing or non-fruit-bearing. There is no in-between. But the bearing of healthy fruit requires drastic pruning. The Lord promises that we will bear much fruit if we abide in him and allow him to purify us.

Congratulations to our second grade students who this weekend received Holy Communion for the first time. Please pray for them and for their parents and guardians that they continue to receive Jesus into their hearts very often, so they become more like Him.

I want to thank all of you who participated in our meeting of the To Teach Who Christ Is campaign. It was a very good and fruitful evening last Monday. May God reward you for all your pledges into the campaign and for all you do to make this parish even greater.

This Sunday I will be leaving for Poland to visit my family and participate in my nephew's First Holy Communion. I will be gone for 10 days, so please say a prayer for me. Fr. Tom McQuaid, Monsignor John Canary and Fr. Jan Wachala will be here with you while I am gone. I am so grateful for their help, so I can go and spend some time with my family back in Poland.

I will see you on the weekend of May 16 &17.



W Ewangelii na dzisiejszą V Niedzielę Wielkanocy, Jezus określa Siebie mianem "prawdziwej winnicy". Ziemię izraelską od dawna pokrywały winnice; nic zatem dziwnego, łż dla Żydów roślina ta ma głębokie znaczenie symbolicznoreligijne. Prorok Izajasz nazwał Lud Izraela "winnicą Pana Zastępów" (Księga Izajasza 5:7). Prorok Jeremiasz wspomina z kolei, iż Bóg zasadził Izrael "jako szlachetną latorośl winną" (Księga Jeremiasza 2:21). Nazywając siebie "prawdziwą winnicą", Syn Boży stanowczo podkreśla, że sama przynależność do konkretnego ludu lub rodu nie wystarczy, aby objąć przeznaczone nam dziedzictwo. Wstęp do prawdziwej "winnicy Pańskiej" możemy uzyskać jedynie poprzez Jezusa Chrystusa.

Mesjasz oferuje nam prawdziwe życie – to, które pochodzi od Boga i wydaje obfite owoce. Zanim winorośl wyda dobry owoc, plantator musi ją najpierw odpowiednio przyciąć. Winorośl posiada dwa rodzaje gałęzi – takie, które wydają owoce i takie bez owoców. Ten drugi rodzaj gałęzi trzeba delikatnie obciąć, aby winorośl mogła wydać jak najlepsze owoce. Właśnie takie owoce: "sprawiedliwość, pokój i radość w Duchu Świętym" (List do Rzymian 14:17) rodzą ci, którzy podążają za Chrystusem.


Owa opowieść o winorośli zawiera prostą prawdę – każdy z nas jest taką rośliną, która albo wydaje owoce, albo nie. Winorośl wymaga dokładnej pielęgnacji, jeśli ma wydać doskonałe owoce. Pan Jezus nas oczyści, jeśli tylko będziemy Mu wierni. Dzięki temu wydamy wspaniałe owoce.

Bardzo im dziękuję za pomoc i wsparcie; dzięki temu mogę spokojnie spędzić trochę czasu z bliskimi w Polsce. Wracam w weekend 16 i 17 maja.

## SCHOOL NEWS GET BEHIND THE VEST CAMPAIGN

After that, they are responsible for purchasing replacement vests. Bulletproof vests need to be replaced every five years or as soon as they come in contact with a bullet. The cost of a new vest starts at \$500.

St. Richard School feels very passionate about this campaign because police officers work hard to keep all of us safe and protected. Now it is our turn to help and protect them.

St. Richard Student Council is hosting a *Get Behind the Vest* Blue Out and Ice Cream Fundraiser. On May 5th, Students will dress in all blue and purchase ice cream snacks during lunch. All proceeds will be given to the CPMF *Get Behind the Vests* Campaign.

#### Infant Baptisms

All arrangements should be made at least one month in advance by calling the Parish Offfice. Baptisms take place normally on the 1st (English) & 2nd (Polish) Sundays of the month. In preparation of the child's baptism, parents must attend a mandatory Parent Preparation Session which both parents must attend. These preparation sessions are held once a month. Families must be registered parishioners of the parish for at least six months prior to the baptism.

#### Weddings

Weddings are celebrated at 1:00PM and 2:30PM on Saturday afternoons. No arrangements should be made before first meeting with the parish priest. Arrangements should be made by calling the Parish Office for an appointment with one of the priests. According to Archdiocesan policy, arrangements are begun at least six months in advance.

#### Communion for the Sick and Homebound

We ask that you please help us remain informed about parishioners who are hospitalized, homebound or in a nursing home.

Our Ministers of Care will gladly bring Communion to anyone who is sick or homebound at a time that is convenient for you. If you would like to receive Communion at home, please call the Parish Office to make the necessary arrangements.
