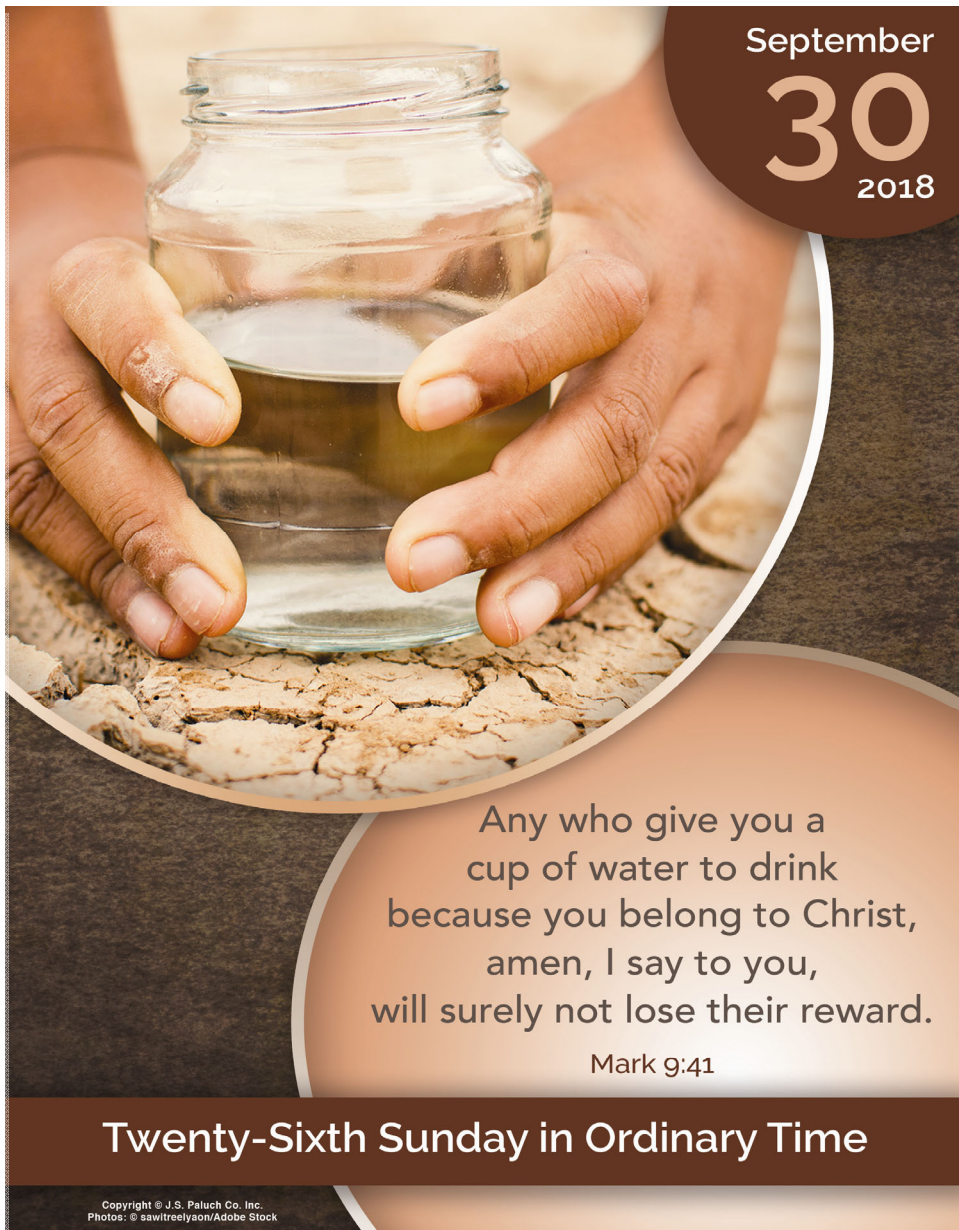

Welcome to Saint Richard Parish

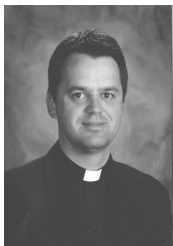
It is with joy that we welcome everyone who has come here to worship

Do we rejoice in the good that others do? In the gospel for this Sunday, Jesus reprimands his disciples for their jealousy and suspicion. They were upset that someone who was not of their company was performing a good work in the name of Jesus. Are we not like the disciples when we get upset at the good deeds of others who seem to shine more than us? Paul says that "love is not jealous... but rejoices in the right" (1 Corinthians 13:4,6). Envy and jealousy are sinful because they lead us to sorrow over what should make us rejoice - namely, our neighbor's good. How can we overcome envy? With the love that God has put into our hearts through the gift of the Holy Spirit (Romans 5:5). The Holy Spirit purifies our heart and frees us from our disordered passions, such as envy, jealousy, greed, and bitterness.

At the end of the gospel reading, Jesus warns his disciples of the terrible responsibility that they have, namely, they must set no stumbling block in the way of another, that is, not give offense or bad example that might lead another to sin. The Greek word for temptation (*scandalon*) is exactly the same as the English word *scandal*. The original meaning of scandal is a trap or a stumbling block which causes one to trip and fall. The Jews held that it was an unforgivable sin to teach another to sin. If we teach another to sin, he or she in turn may teach still another, until a train of sin is set in motion with no foreseeable end. The young in faith are especially vulnerable to the bad example of those who should be passing on the faith. Do we set a good example for others to follow, especially the young?

We are beginning the month of October already. As you know this month is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary and to the Rosary. Please make sure to use this powerful tool - the rosary - especially in this month and pray for the healing of our church. *Mary, Queen of the most holy Rosary- pray for us.*

Czytania mszalne tej niedzieli mówią o grzechu zazdrości. Uczucie zazdrości było znane również apostołom. Jan przychodzi do Jezusa mówiąc, że spotkał człowieka, który Jego mocą wyrzucał złe duchy i zabronił mu, gdyż nie należał do grona uczniów. Czym kierował się umiłowany Apostoł Jezusa? Pewnie zazdrością! Jednak zdumiewa nas i zadziwia postawa Mistrza z Nazaretu. Jezus tak bardzo szanuje wolność każdego człowieka, że pozwala używać swojej mocy nawet tym, którzy są z dala od Niego. On jest cierpliwy. Wie, że każde dobro, które człowiek czyni drugiemu, powinno w końcu doprowadzić do lepszego poznania Boga. Zazdrość to forma nienawiści drugiego człowieka, a przejawia się jako smutek z powodu cudzego szczęścia i radość z powodu jego nieszczęścia. Zazdrość jest nowotworem ludzkiego serca. Jak powstaje zazdrość? Mechanizm jest prosty. W sercu człowieka jedno włókno przestaje kochać. Dlaczego kogoś nie kochamy? Najczęściej dlatego, że nie chce być naszą wyłączną własnością, albo kocha kogoś, kogo my kochamy. Jak zatem należy zachować się wobec ludzi zazdrosnych? Jest możliwa tylko jedna jedyna pomoc – trzeba kochać zazdrośnika. Wielkość ludzkiego powołania należy sprowadzić do miłości. Człowiek jest szczęśliwy, kiedy innych do szczęścia doprowadza, bo miłość nie zna uczucia zazdrości. Jako chrześcijanie powinniśmy sobie nawzajem pomagać w lepszym poznaniu wymagań Pana Boga. Miłość Boża nie jest uzależniona od naszej osobistej świętości; to raczej nasza świętość zależy od miłości Boga do nas i powinna być miłością odpowiedzialną.

Czas szybko biegnie, już rozpoczynamy miesiąc październik, a wiemy, że jest to miesiąc w szczególności poświęcony Matce Bożej i modlitwie różańcowej. Zachęcam abyśmy częściej sięgali po różaniec i za pośrednictwem Matki Bożej zanosili do Boga nasze modlitwy. Pamiętajmy szczególnie teraz o modlitwie za nasz Kościół Katolicki.
