Join us as we give thanks and praise and glory to God!


If you are not already an active member of this community, we ask you to consider in sharing in what we have to offer.

The gospel for this Sunday, the 4th and last Sunday of Advent, talks about the Blessed Virgin Mary visiting her cousin Elizabeth. What is the significance of Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth before the birth of Jesus? When Elizabeth greeted Mary and recognized the Messiah in Mary's womb, they were both filled with the Holy Spirit and with a joyful anticipation of the fulfillment of God's promise to give a Savior. What a marvelous wonder for God to fill not only Elizabeth's heart with his Holy Spirit but also the child in her womb as well. John the Baptist, even before the birth of the Messiah. This pointed to Christ's coming and so John leaped for joy in the womb of his mother as the Holy Spirit revealed to him the presence of the King to be born. The Holy Spirit is God's gift to us to enable us to know and experience the indwelling presence of God and the power of his kingdom. The Holy Spirit is the way in which God reigns within each of us. Do you live in the joy and knowledge of God's indwelling presence with you through his Holy Spirit?

The birth of Jesus Christ is very close. It is already this coming Friday that we will be celebrating Christmas. "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined" (Is 9:1). "An angel of the Lord appeared to [the shepherds] and the glory of the Lord shone around them" (Lk 2:9). This is how the liturgy of this holy Christmas night presents to us the birth of the Savior: as the light which pierces and dispels the deepest darkness. The presence of the Lord in the midst of his people cancels the sorrow of defeat and the misery of slavery, and ushers in joy and happiness.

I would like to take a moment as we enter the final week of Advent to wish you a very Merry Christmas. I pray that all four of these weeks of Advent which we have celebrated will fill your lives in every best way this Christmas and beyond into the New Year.

Thank you for your faithfulness and commitment to our parish. As I look back, I am overwhelmed with gratitude. I'm grateful just to be a part of this community and to get to walk this journey with you. I feel so privileged to be part of a group of people who are honestly and passionately taking on the challenge to follow Jesus in all the trials, joys and complexities of modern life.

W Ewangelii na dzisiejszą ostatnią, IV Niedzielę Adwentu, jest mowa o odwiedzinach Maryi u jej kuzynki Elżbiety. Co jest takiego szczególnego w tym fragmencie? Elżbieta powitała Maryję i od razu rozpoznała Mesjasza w Jej łonie. Wówczas to, obie zostały napełnione Duchem Świętym i radością oczekiwania na wypełnienie się Bożej obietnicy o Zbawicielu. Najcudowniejsze jest tutaj to, iż Pan napełnił Swoim Duchem nie tylko Elżbietę, lecz także rozwijające się w niej dziecko, Jana Chrzciciela – i to jeszcze przed narodzinami Jezusa. Tak Bóg zapowiedział nadejście Swego Syna i już w łonie matki św. Jan radował się, poznawszy dzięki Duchowi tożsamość przyszłego Króla. Bóg udzielił nam Daru Ducha Świętego, abyśmy mogli rozpoznać rodzące się pośród nas Królestwo Boże.

Chrystus jest bardzo blisko. Już w najbliższy piątek świętować będziemy Boże Narodzenie. „Naród kroczący w ciemnościach ujrzał światłość wielką; nad mieszkańcami kraju mroków światło zabłysło” (Księga Izajasza 9:1). „Naraz stanął przy nich [pasterzach] anioł Pański i chwała Pańska zewsząd ich oświeciła...” (Ewangelia według św. Łukasza 2:9). Właśnie tak Narodziny Zbawiciela ukazane są w liturgii wigilijnej – jako światłość przenikająca i rozpraszająca najgłębszy nawet mrok. Pan obecny wśród Swego Ludu wyzwala go z cierpienia i smutku; zaprowadza pokój i radość.

U progu tego ostatniego tygodnia Adwentu, pragnę Wam wszystkim serdecznie życzyć Wesołych Świąt! Modłę się o to, aby ten mijający okres adwentowy ubogacił Was na mnóstwo różnych sposobów, oraz, aby te otrzymane łaski pozostały już z Wami nie tylko w Święta, ale każdego dnia Waszego życia.

Bóg Zapłać za wszystko, co robicie dla naszej Parafii. Wspominam mijający rok i przepelnia mnie wdzięczność. Dziękuję Wam za to, że mogę być częścią tej wspaniałej społeczności, która z takim zaangażowaniem podąża za Jezusem – wyboistą drogą przez wyzwania, jakie nam stawia współczesny świat.

As we light the last candle on the Advent wreath, one of my favorite games I enjoy at this time of the year is “remember when.” Remember when...you couldn't fall asleep because you were perched at the window waiting for Santa; trying to figure out how he squeezed down the chimney; live trees were sold for \$1.99 w/coupon.; everyone had a Polk Brothers Santa Claus statue; when carols were not played on the radio until the week of Christmas; and prior to '68 all churches had live fragrant trees trimmed w/tinsel. Remember when Midnight mass was standing room only and the 8th grade girls were dressed as angels carrying in the newborn baby Jesus; and when somebody broke the baby Jesus statue for the manger and the only replacement was larger than Mary and Joseph. Remember when everyone said “Merry Christmas” instead of “Happy Holidays;” shopping areas were decorated and Christmas music was even piped outside into the streets; door-to-door caroling was a regular sight in the neighborhood; the fad to own an aluminum or stainless steel tree w/revolving color light wheel was considered the best (PS: the inventor of the toilet brush also held the patent for the novelty tree). Remember when your parents had a special place to hide the presents and homemade cookies until the big day; the “big” stores were only open on Sundays a couple of weeks prior to Christmas day; when you had to get your flu shot before the mistletoe was hung and if you didn't know the words to the ethnic Christmas carols at least you could hum along with the melody. Remember when your parents saved the coal you got in your stocking to use in the barbecue; at times the presents were wrapped in the Sunday funnies; directions detailing some assembly required of the Christmas toys did not take a day and a half, plus an engineering degree before we could play with them. Remember when most of us believed in and were grateful that God so loved the world that he sent us his only Son, Jesus Christ to save us all from Satan's call and we gathered at mass before we sat down for our traditional family feasts. So please make this Christmas special, especially in this Year of Divine Mercy, that we have forgiven someone who has hurt us, contacted someone we have been out of touch with whether due to lack of time or stress, visited someone who has been sick or homebound, lonely, widowed or distant from our faith or church and share with them the joy of the season particularly the birth of God's newborn Son. Think how differently our world and lives would be if there never was a Christmas.

Interestingly enough, the December National Geographic Magazine cover story names Blessed Mother as the “Most Powerful Woman of the Year!” They are also airing an episode on the worldwide Marian devotion today. The magazine is recognizing the gentle power of Jesus' mother. While the show has not yet aired, National Geographic's project has already transformed the life of one person: its photographer Diana Markosian. I hope to catch it and hope you will too. 


ST. RICHARD CCW COAT AND ACCESSORY DRIVE

LAS POSADAS -

In Mexico, Christmas is an important holiday season with strong traditions. One of the most colorful traditions is the posada, celebrated every evening from December 16th to 24th.

These celebrations commemorate Mary and Joseph's cold and difficult journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem in search of shelter. "Posada," in Spanish, simply means lodging or shelter.

Families begin the nine-day observance of Las Posadas by reenacting the Holy Family's nine day journey to Bethlehem and their search for shelter in a posada or inn. Two costumed children carry small statues of Mary and Joseph as they lead a candlelight procession from house to house. They sing a song asking for shelter for the weary travelers. When at last they find a place that will give shelter, the children say a prayer of thanks and place the figures of Mary and Joseph in that house.

We will be celebrating a Posada Procession in our church **Tues., December 22nd at 6PM**. We invite everyone to join us for this special service.

INFANT BAPTISMS

All arrangements should be made at least one month in advance by calling the Parish Office. Baptisms take place normally on the 1st (English) & 2nd (Polish) Sundays of the month. In preparation of the child's baptism, parents must attend a mandatory Parent Preparation Session which both parents must attend. These preparation sessions are held once a month.

WEDDINGS

Weddings are celebrated at 1:00PM and 2:30PM on Saturday afternoons. No arrangements should be made before first meeting with the parish priest. Arrangements should be made by calling the Parish Office for an appointment with one of the priests. According to Archdiocesan policy, arrangements are begun at least six months in advance.

COMMUNION FOR THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND

We ask that you please help us remain informed about parishioners who are hospitalized, homebound or in a nursing home.

Our Ministers of Care will gladly bring Communion to anyone who is sick or homebound at a time that is convenient for you. If you would like to receive Communion at home, please call the Parish Office to make the necessary arrangements.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM/C.C.D.

Our Religious Education/C.C.D. Program enhances and supports the Christian values taught and lived within the family. We provide formal religious education and sacramental preparation classes for students in kindergarten through eighth grade. Please call the Parish Office to register.

4th Sunday of Advent

For behold, when the voice of your greeting came to my ears, the babe in my womb leaped for joy." (Luke 1:44)

When you hear the scripture readings and Gospel reading each Sunday, do you "leap for joy?" If not, don't blame the lecturer or priest, rather look inside yourself. Do you prepare for Mass each week or do you just show up and expect to be entertained.
