Welcome to Saint Richard Parish


It is with joy that we welcome everyone who has come here to worship

The Gospel accounts frequently describe how Jesus had to face unjust accusations made by the Pharisees, the ruling elders of Israel. They were upset with Jesus' teaching and they wanted to discredit him in any way they could. They wanted to not only silence him, but to get rid of him because of his claim to speak with God's authority. When a moral dilemma or difficult legal question arose, it was typical for the Jews to take the matter to a rabbi for a decision. The scribes and the Pharisees brought to Jesus a woman who had been caught in the act of adultery. Jewish law treated adultery as a serious crime since it violated God's ordinance and wreaked destruction on the stability of marriage and family life. It was one of the three gravest sins punishable by death. If Jesus said the woman must be pardoned, he would be accused of breaking the law of Moses. If he said the woman must be stoned, he would lose his reputation for being the merciful friend of sinners. But Jesus does something quite unexpected, He turns the challenge towards his accusers. In effect he says: Go ahead and stone her! But let the man who is without sin be the first to cast a stone. The Lord leaves the matter to their own consciences. When the adulterous woman is left alone with Jesus, he both expresses mercy and he strongly urges her to not sin again. The scribes wished to condemn, Jesus wished to forgive and to restore the sinner to health. His challenge involved a choice - either to go back to her former way of sin and death or to reach out to God's offer of forgiveness, restoration, and new life in his kingdom of peace and righteousness.

Next week with Palm Sunday we will begin the Holy Week. I want to encourage you to take some time from your busy schedule and reflect on the passion, death and resurrection of our Lord. I hope that you will be able to participate and pray with us on Holy Thursday, when we commemorate Jesus washing the disciples' feet and establishing the Eucharist; on Good Friday, when we commemorate Jesus' passion and death on the cross; and on Holy Saturday vigil mass of the resurrection of our Lord with the blessing of the fire and water. I also invite the lectors and Eucharistic Ministers to help by assisting during the masses in this holy time, we always need your help.

Have a blessed Holy Week!

Wielki Post ma być dla nas czasem spotkania z Bogiem miłosierdzia, który zbawia, wyzwala, dokonuje duchowej odnowy ludzkiego serca. W zapowiadany przez proroków Mesjaszu rozpoczyna się na nowo historia człowieka. On „swoimi słowami, gestami i całą swoją osobą objawia miłosierdzie Boga”. Dzięki Niemu otrzymujemy nowe życie. Aby otrzymać nowe życie, potrzeba osobistego spotkania się z Miłością miłosierną. Z Bogiem czułym, delikatnym, pochylonym nad dzieckiem, a jednocześnie wyraźnie rozróżniającego grzech od grzesznika.

Takiego Boga doświadczyła kobieta opisana we fragmencie Ewangelii przeznaczonym na dzisiejszą niedzielę: „Jezus nie patrzył na nią. Schyliwszy się pisał palcem na ziemi. Święty Hieronim twierdzi, że wyliczał w ten sposób grzechy oskarżycieli. Syn Człowieczy wiedząc, że ta nieszczęsna omdlewa raczej ze wstydu niż ze strachu, nie patrzył na nią, są bowiem chwile w życiu człowieka, kiedy największym miłosierdziem jest nie widzieć go. Cała miłość Chrystusa dla grzeszników wyraża się w tym odwróconym wzroku. Trzeba widzieć także i to, że kobieta, którą do Niego przyprowadzono, nie wypierała się, nie usprawiedliwiała, nie wskazywała nawet na innych, na współników jej grzechów, nie twierdziła, że jest bez grzechu i dlatego potrzebowała Jezusa. A dziś Jezus pyta: Kto z was jest bez grzechu? Każdy z nas musi spojrzeć na siebie bez udawania, obłudy, oszukiwania się. Przecież Chrystus już nieraz udowadniał, że zna ludzkie myśli... Spowiadamy się z „grzechów cudzych”, oskarżamy, napiętnujemy, domagamy się sprawiedliwości, jesteśmy oburzeni. A Jezus „pisze nam nasze grzechy” i czeka na nasze nawrócenie. Po co więc szukać najpierw błędów u innych, po co oskarżać i napiętnować ich wady? Poczytaj to co Jezus pisze dla ciebie. Nie doświadczysz miłosierdzia Bożego, jeśli będziesz stale twierdził, że nie masz grzechów, że jesteś zdrowy, że masz „tylko lekki katar” i że jesteś bez grzechu, to niepotrzebny ci ani lekarz, ani Boże Miłosierdzie. Spróbuj jednak zdać się na Jezusa, które jak nikt inny zna prawdę o tobie, najlepiej wie, co ci dolega i w jaki sposób uwolnić się od swojej słabości.

Za tydzień niedzielą palmową wkroczymy w wielki tydzień. Zachęcam, aby zatrzymać się na chwilę i przeżyć ten tydzień jak najlepiej. Odłożyć na chwilę goniącą przedświąteczną i więcej się pomodlić, być lepszym i uczestniczyć w liturgii Wielkiego Tygodnia od Wielkiego Czwartku, aż do Niedzieli Zmartwychwstania. Jak co roku zachęcam i zapraszam górali w strojach regionalnych do czerwienia przy grobie Pańskim oraz do udziału w porannej procesji rezurekcyjnej.



MONSIGNOR JOHN CANARY CELEBRATES GOLDEN JUBILEE

Monsignor Canary was ordained as a priest for the Archdiocese of Chicago on May 14, 1969 and served faithfully as a parish priest, rector of Mundelein Seminary and Vicar General for our archdiocese. I personally have known Monsignor Canary for almost 20 years when I first came to Chicago and joined the University of St. Mary of The Lake in Mundelein. He was my rector. Monsignor Canary is my good friend and mentor and he also enriched our community of St. Richard with his presence, his love for our parishioners and his wisdom in his preaching. That's why I want to invite all of you to come together and celebrate Monsignor's 50th anniversary as a priest.
